Executive Committee Reports

Secretary Report – Brendan Ward

Wow, what a year. Another massive season under the belt with many challenges and plenty of great stories and massive successes for the club. The season began with the election of our Executive Committee for the season and to everyone that put their hand up for a position, a big thank you goes to you. Anyone willing to volunteer their time for this club is a testament to themselves and without you, we would not function.

This report may jump all over the place, but I want to make sure I cover all the great things happening in our club this season, so strap in, it'll be a long one.

We had a new challenge to start with in PlayHQ leaving our old system of MyCricket behind. Well unless you need to use the app, which was still MyCricket. Confusing for everyone and more so for everyone forced to interact with it, it proved to be a real headache for many to begin the season with. A thanks goes to Dylan Chew for helping set up the administration side of PlayHQ and helping prepare the club for the start of the season. We are pleased to say that PlayHQ improved throughout the season, and while it still has its moments, it looks to continue improving in the off-season and in the long run will prove to be an improvement over the old MyCricket system. Hopefully sooner, rather than later.

We ran an Off-Season training program this season. Although affected by rain we still got a number of weeks in and saw great numbers attending. This followed into Pre-Season and then Regular season training also moved to twice weekly this season for the first time in several years and numbers remained strong throughout. I would like to first offer a thanks to Rohan for coaching and the hours he put in down at the nets throughout, followed by Starry for his coordination of the Men's nets. Lastly a thanks to all those that trained, helped their fellow Magpies out and ran drills when required.

This season we tackled a new challenge with the FrogBox. An innovation in showcasing everything LOCC has to offer and great way to display the highs and lows of cricket. Much like PlayHQ (and because of PlayHQ), FrogBox had a rocky start. But by the end of the season it was like a well oiled machine that worked almost without fail. We were proud to stream the highs of our U16's Black GF win and Women's 3rd Grade GF win, and also show the grit and determination in defeat shown by our Women's 2nd Grade and Men's 3rd Grade defeats in their GF and SF's respectively. These moments will be forever captured for all of LOCC to view. It hasn't been easy, from scheduling games each week, getting to games to set it up or organising people to learn to set it up and then have them set it up but I'm proud that as a club we have lead the way on this front, and I would like to thank everyone that has helped throughout. We were capturing up to 5 games a week at some stages and it is a testament to this club that we have done so. Finally, I'm proud to have cut the highlights packages for the games throughout

the season that can also be found on our YouTube alongside the livestreams for everyone to view long into the future. (@lisarowourimbahcc on YouTube)

This season we have applied for numerous grants with some being successful. I would wholeheartedly like to thank Simon Bauer for his work on writing most of them and for Dave Winiata's help for many of them in his role as CCA Administrator. Simon successfully wrote the grant that will help us replace the current Sohier 4 pitch, built by Eugene however many years ago (probably illegally). It will become a proper full length, full width pitch allowing for proper training on it for Seniors and Juniors, as well as a better environment for our U10's and Girls Sixers to play on weekly. I also successfully applied for a Sports Equipment grant that will see us purchase training kits for many of our Junior teams for next season. Both those grants have been through the NSW State Government grants for The Entrance electorate. I was unsuccessful in our application to a Federal grant to cover the costs of some of the refurbishment of our older nets, however we are still awaiting the outcome of a Cricket Australia grant that Simon has applied for to also help cover some of the costs of those net refurbishments.

Simon also put in major work for a grant to upgrade our existing turf wicket and add in turf nets however we were unsuccessful on that front too. I was also successful in helping obtain 2 new environmentally friendly fridges for us at Sohier Park. The large one has been placed in the hall which many of you will have noticed throughout the season, and the small one will be in the Scorer's box in the grandstand for players and scorers to use throughout their games. Thanks to Dave Winiata for travelling down to Ingleburn to pick them up and thanks to Hayden Paterick for storing the small fridge in our off-season. Overall for grants, we will keep working towards the short-term goal of turf nets, as well as a major long-term plan to upgrade our facilities at Sohier Park.

Early in the season, I raised the potential of an additional shipping container to go next to our current container to help with storage of the mower, roller, covers etc. as well as provide a backup to our current container which is showing signs of its age. I have now finalised the Development Application (that was a new learning experience) and have now been waiting approximately 60 days for confirmation of whether we are successful or not. Hopefully will have a full DA approval soon, which will allow us to purchase another container. I would like to thank Dylan Chew for his help on this, providing the club with a Statement of Environmental Effects which we would've needed to hire someone to provide otherwise. Fingers crossed to seeing an additional shipping container in Season 23/24.

We were proud to finally unveil and use our new nets this season. Our official unveiling was a great day and it was great to see them named The Mark Royston Nets, after all the work Roysto has put into not just those nets but our older set as well and the thousands of volunteer hours he has put into the club elsewhere. I'd like to thank Roysto and Simon for their work on making the nets happen, and I'd like to thank Bliss Demolition, Phil Duncan Excavations, Phil Rearden Fencing for their donations of time, resources and labour to the project too. And finally a thanks to the volunteers that helped finish them off, cleaned up around them, many hands helped out

but especially Josh Hopkins for spending many hours moving and spreading soil on the excavator.

This year we finally saw the drainage works at Sohier Park completed, almost 9 months behind schedule. This resulted in 1st Grade playing away till January, 2nd Grade playing Sunday's and away till January, as well as 3rd-6th Grade pretty much always away too for most of the season. I'd like to thank all our teams for bearing the brunt of this and still having successful seasons. On the plus side, Sohier Park is back to being one of the top grounds on the coast, with drainage to help guarantee we get on the field more than most other clubs. Also the turf wicket benefited from a much lighter schedule, and hopefully with a proper off-season and continued maintenance it will be rejuvenated for next season. A big thanks to those that helped get us back on the field when council and contractors saw fit to leave many divots and holes throughout the field and around the wickets. We had 10+ players from our teams including our Youth sides help wheelbarrow and shovel sand and soil for a couple of hours one Sunday which gave us the opportunity to play the next week, as well put the field in much better condition for the rest of the season.

This season we were proud to welcome over Ross Forrester, from English club Winchmore Hill, a connection started by Scott Burkinshaw when he went over to England to play. We are always wanting to continue the tradition of players being able to travel overseas and to Australia to explore their cricketing journey. Ross was a key part of our Men's 1st Grade side, taking out the Batting award as well as helping coach our Male Youth League team. I'd like to thank the Sunshine's, Cheryl and Phil for accepting Ross into their home, as well as the Hughes family for also housing Ross on his journey. Without the contributions of both families these arrangements aren't possible, and it is a testament to them and their commitment of LOCC.

We had something completely new happen at the club this season too. We welcomed Channel 7 along to one of our training sessions to interview a few members of the club to promote the Toyota Good for Cricket Raffle, the final edit making it's debut during the Australian Test Summer. Although some acting careers may have failed to launch, we still thank everyone that took part and helping to showcase all the great things about our club. As a club we raised over \$2000 for our Juniors through the Good for Cricket Raffle, so I also would like to thank everyone that purchased a ticket or many tickets and helped support the club.

The club continued to partner with One Culture Support Services in running our All Abilities Program. The work they do is brilliant and is helping to promote cricket to anyone that wishes to play and is removing the barriers many people face when trying to play cricket. A big thank you to Eugene on this as well, as he is the main driver of this program and I think we can still do a lot more to help drive it and participate further in it. The program runs every Wednesday arvo, and for anyone looking to go along and help out and get involved I'd highly recommend it.

A few other mentions of the happening's around our club for the season. We were proud to run Trials for our Male Youth League side for the first time. This is a great testament to the strength and number of players we have coming through that landscape and the ability shown during the

trials was fantastic. We saw the creation of a new Covers trolley. Although still a slight work in progress, the old trolley badly needed replacing and it is great that this has now been done. Thanks to everyone that helped work on it and build it.

I have also set up a new Online Shop, where players, supporters etc. can go and purchase extra merchandise. We will continue with how we normally give out clothing, but many people like extra hats, shirts etc. and this also lets us sell leftover clothing from previous clothing runs like Shorts, Jumpers, Vests and more. We also saw the club's first ever "Photo Day". A big shout-out to Carly Kidd for pushing this. Many of us were unsure on it to begin with but no one can deny the results of the photos for both Juniors and Seniors. I also have gone through and updated the Club's Stats from 1980 onwards with this years stats, as well as update the Century's Honour Board, the Club's Perpetual Trophy Winners, the Women's Player's Numbers and will very soon have finalised the Club's Player's Numbers. Some of these projects started as neat ideas during Covid and I'm glad to say they are a great record for any past and present members to go back and look through. On a similar note, I'd like to thank Mark Royston for his help working with me to organise and confirm all the stats and trophies for Presentation Night.

Finally, I've got a lot of people I'd like to thank that have helped out throughout the season in their roles and made the running of the club that much smoother. In no particular order, a big thanks to Brendan O'Rourke and Ashlee MacKenzie for heading their respective Selection Committees. We tried something new this season with Captains having much more involvement and I believe the results were positive, a thanks too for the Captains themselves taking the time to be more involved as well.

Thanks to Captains and Coaches for filling out their Marsh Insurance week in week out, after my reminders each week. We excelled on this front this season which essentially resulted in getting our full Club of the Year points from CCCA which gives us a full \$2000 from the CCCA. On the same note, a big thank you to our Captains in general for their work throughout the season. Between meetings for new balls, key swaps, reading all my messages throughout the week, helping with selections, welcoming new players and in particular juniors into teams, delivering clothing and on and on it goes before even considering the work on the field, you all deserve a big wrap and I'd encourage all players to reach out to their skippers and thank them for their work.

A big thanks to Matthew Ball for his work on our clothing, placing orders and doing designs, as well as Dave Winiata helping to coordinate the Junior clothing. I may be the delivery boy for Seniors but Bally handled all the design, ordering and discussions with suppliers which is a big job, so again a big thanks to Bally. Thanks to CCCA for their work throughout the season across

the board. I was welcomed into the By-Laws meeting this season and was able to help in their finalisation for this season. But across the board the CCCA deserve recognition for managing and running our competition year in year out. There are always disagreements, but I think we'd have to be one of the top managed districts in NSW and possibly the country.

A thanks to our Social Media team for stepping up week in week out in getting out all our important items. This season was a big year financially for the club with a huge number of operating transactions made in our working account. There was gross revenue of \$132,224 with payments of \$143,643 made resulting in a net operating loss of \$11,419. This included payments that were made for last season's capital costs of the new nets as well as overdue presentation expenses. Also, a

contingency fund was opened with a term deposit of \$20,000. Allowing for these non-recurring expenses next season leaves the club in a good financial position going forward.

Thank you for the opportunity to continue to grow and adapt this fairly new role of the Women's Delegate (2nd season since its addition to the committee board).

The club ran 2 nights of the Female's Come and Try events at Tumby Indoor Sports Centre. Something we are still evolving, with new ideas on how we can improve, taken on board for future events. Regardless, it was once a successful night recruiting new junior and senior women's players. Thank you to those from the club who helped run the drills throughout the 2 events. Thank you to the club for providing Pizza for dinner and our sponsors for our Lucky door prizes. The pizza was a big hit amongst all involved, thank you Darren Bates for delivering.

This season was the first year we created a welcome package, which was emailed out to all senior, female players who registered before the season began. The package included, the committee contacts, links to all LOCC social media, information about pre-season training, then the information about training throughout the season, the Club Coaches message, information about captain selections, game availability process, game day information, FrogBox information, post-match information and the CCCA draft of season playing dates, last but not the very least; the Club song. The discussion is to add more information into the above, eg; selection criteria.

Season ahead, saw the club's second year in submitting 4 senior women's sides in the CCCA. This time a slight change with 1 x 1st grade (9 a side), 2 x 2nd grades (8 a sides) and a new competition saw a submission of 1 x 3rd grade (8 a side).

57 players took the field at some point over the 2022/2023 season, across 4 senior grades. 16 of those were junior players, that is 41 women, all to show the increased desire to play cricket on the coast.

Previous year, 2021-2022 there were 50 players (40 seniors + 10 juniors).

With a successful season the year before, 3 returning captains took their places at the helm; Amy Cunningham (1st), Stacey McNeill (2nd White) and Vanessa Bird (2nd Black).

This season we took a chance on developing the youth into the leaders of our great Magpie's, with Kayla Silver-Holmes and Abigail Clark, jointly running the 3rd Grade ship.

Thank you to all the above captains for all their support throughout the season, on and off the field, especially with the team selections.

Thank you to all coaching staff involved, the below results show all the talent the club has but all the support coaching staff have given to nurture and to grow the talent.
